Getting Started

Depending on the service you want to complete, you must provide acceptable documents. There are currently three categories: primary ID, proof of Oklahoma residency, and documents for 100% disabled veterans.

Primary Identity Documents

You must present proof of identity or legal presence in the U.S. Documents must be original or certified copies. Notarized documents are not accepted. Valid examples include: valid Oklahoma drivers license, birth certificate, U.S. passport, permanent resident card, certificate of naturalization, EAD, foreign passport with valid visa and I-94, among others. Military or tribal IDs are not accepted as primary ID.

Legal Presence Documents

Each document must be an original or certified copy. Examples include: permanent resident card (I-551), EAD (I-766), foreign passport with visa and I-94, forms F-1/I-20, H-1A/B, J-1/DS-2019, etc. Legal presence is required for every renewal or replacement.

Name Change Documents

If your name differs across documents, you must provide legal documentation for each change: marriage certificate, divorce decree, court order, certificate of naturalization, valid passport, etc. All must be original or certified copies.

Social Security Number

For some services, your Social Security Number is required. It is not necessary to show the physical card, but you must know the full number.

Proof of Oklahoma Residency

You must present two documents showing your name and physical address in Oklahoma. Examples: utility bills, bank statements, W-2 or 1099, government or school correspondence, lease agreements, insurance policies, professional licenses, tax returns, gun license, etc.

Documents for 100% Disabled Veterans

Must be original or certified copies: a letter from the Department of Veterans Affairs confirming 100% disability and the Oklahoma sales tax exemption card.
